The vowel “u” in different forms is normally placed below the consonant or cluster.

Attached on the main corpus of the sign:

ku khu ghu tsu tshu dzhu du tu thu du dhu nu pu phu bu bhu yu lu wu su su hu ksu

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Attached on the vertical stroke of the sign:

gu nu mu

Below the sign with a connection to the basis:

Below the sign without a connection to the basis



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Special form for the vowel “u” in connection with consonant „r“: 



r + u = ru

All consonant clusters with the last consonant „r“ are written analog.

 but don't confuse with 




Consonant “h” with attached “u”  analog for  huṃ









































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In handwritten manuscripts a different graph for „u “ is used:
